Who is a Kinship youth? A Kinship youth is a child between the ages of 5 and 16 who would benefit from having a special relationship with an adult committed to future generations. These children/youth are children that value friendship, affection, advice, guidance and meaningful adult

What are a few things Kinship mentors do?

- Help a child discover and develop his or her strengths
- Be a reliable and dependable friend
- Listen and offer emotional support to a child in a non-judgmental manner
- Share relevant experiences from their own life
- Establish trust and friendship
- Listen to and stand by a child through joys and frustrations
- Keep confidentiality

What is your favorite food? Steak and shrimp.


Who is the most influential person(s) in your life? My mom. She was a very patient, caring person with a heart of gold. Even though she was sick most of her life, she had the most positive attitude.
