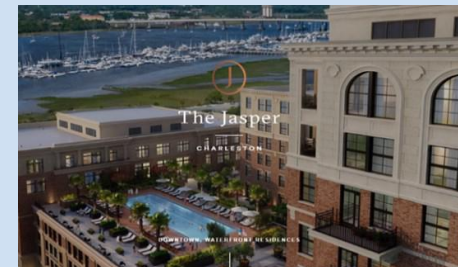
**BIG DEAL!**
